WE EMPHASIZE

not to come in if they are sick and have symptoms like a fever, coughing, shortness of breath, or any other flu-like symptoms.



WE STRONGLY RECOMMEND

that any guests experiencing any symptoms including coughing, fever, shortness of breath, etc., remain at home as to not get any other visitors or our employees sick.



PATTERSON FARM FOLLOWS

Good Agriculture Practices (GAPs), a voluntary audit that verifies fruits and vegetables are produced, packed, handled, and stored as safely as possible to minimize risks of microbial food safety hazards. These practices follow the recommendations made by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration. We require that all employees each year complete GAPs training.
